<p>English Activity 1 - Prepositions</p> <p>A preposition tells us when or where something is in relation to something else. Examples include under, after, inside and outside. Can you write some sentences including prepositions to explain where different items are in your house or garden?</p>	<p>Maths Activity 1 - Money</p> <p>Have a look at the prices on a receipt or make up some of your own prices such as £2.99. Can you find different combinations of coins you could use to pay?</p>	<p>Geography - Choose a contrasting locality in the UK such as rural and coastal to your local area. Can you write some similarities and differences between the your local area and your chosen locality.</p>
<p>English Activity 2 - -sion spelling</p> <p>-sion goes at the end of a word and sounds more like a 'z' than an 's'. For example division. How many words can you think of with -sion in? Can you use some of the words in sentences?</p>	<p>Maths Activity 2 - Right Angle Hunt</p> <p>Can you go on a triangle hunt around your house? Can you record which objects have the shape of an equilateral, isosceles or scalene triangles. You could record your findings by taking photographs or writing a list.</p>	<p>PSHE - Can you create your own anti-bullying poster? Create a slogan or a logo and remember to make your design as eye-catching as possible!</p>

Can you use some effective adjectives to describe the sounds? What is the tempo/rhythm like in the piece of music?</p>
