Make a list or a table to show the transparent, translucent and opaque objects you find around your house. You could draw pictures of each thing. Remember that: If an object lets all the light through and does not make a shadow, it is <u>transparent</u>. If an object lets some light through and makes a faint shadows, it is <u>translucent</u>. If an object lets no light through and makes a dark shadow, it is <u>opaque</u>.</p>
